FIGHTING HUNGER ONE MEAL AT A TIME

Currently, the Rock River Valley Pantry continues to see the need increase for emergency food. Compared to February of last year, our client use has increased by 82%. Yet, thanks to thoughtful donors, retail rescue, dedicated volunteers, Board leadership, and committed staff, we have been able to meet the need.

Beginning this fiscal year, through February, we have provided food for more than 29,700 client visits. Each visit offers up to four days of nutritious food, appropriate for









President's Message

As food costs rise, along with the higher prices for basic needs facing all of us in our community, the Pantry has been experiencing a steady and significant increase in our weekly client numbers. This uptick in client usage has been expected, as the RRVP Board members

recognized in late 2021, that at some point in time the COVIDrelated increase in SNAP benefits and other subsidies would end. However, no one predicted the sharp increase in food costs and its lack of availability.

As reported in the Fall 2022 Newsletter, the Board had embarked earlier in the year to formulate a Three (3) Year Strategic Plan that will enable the Pantry to successfully meet its Mission Statement "The RRVP fights hunger in the community by providing nutritious food to those in urgent need".

Our Strategic Plan was formally completed in February 2023 with a focus on maintaining and enhancing a solid source of funds through grants, sponsorships, fundraising events, donor support, and our Peanut Butter Endowment. The plan also reinforces the absolute need for the Pantry to continue in its efforts to secure nutritious food items for our clients, while also anticipating possible food availability in the future and adjusting our inventory as such. Annual Client Surveys will be conducted in our efforts to determine the clients' nutritional needs and what improvements may need to be explored in our operations, as well as in preferred food choices.

One glowing highlight of our Strategic Plan is the recently completed remodeling of our Broadway satellite pantry location. A renovation that was sorely needed for our clients that we serve in the 61104 zip code area. A client base that accounts for 1/4 of our total overall client usage. An area of Rockford that the Pantry foresees as a potential growing need for our services.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention the passion, dedication and commitment of our volunteers and staff which they project every day in helping our community through their examples of grace, kindness and respect.

Fighting Food Insecurity

On average, we assist 4,500 clients per month. Our clients range from babies to 93 years young. Each person is unique and has different needs. We distribute more than 10,000 cans of vegetables, 1,500 gallons of milk, 2,500 loafs of bread and/or buns, and 3,900 pounds of meat each month, in addition to many other food staples. We strive to provide nutritious food from which the clients select from to feed themselves and their family members. Households may select up to four days' worth of food on a monthly basis, and if needed a second visit can be arranged.
